


Ritz Theater Positive Impact Breakfasts

A Note from our Director of the Ann Street Gallery

Dear Friends.

Just as the longer days and warmer temperatures of summer bring forth the promise of growth and optimism, the Ann Street Gallery moves forward into some new and exciting programming.

Our growing reputation for presenting provocative exhibitions to the public has resulted in yearly increases in the number of visitors to the gallery.

By now, most of you have learned of the tragic loss of our friend and Safe Harbors/Ritz Theater supporter Bill Yost, who passed away in November. Bill left behind his devoted family and friends, who will miss his contagious energy for life and vigor for the arts.

On Saturday, February 25, 2012 the Ann Street Gallery was honored to hold the first major exhibition devoted to the full scope of the Bill's artistic career entitled *Bill Yost: a Retrospective*. In this exhibition we got a unique look at the types of work in Bill's rich and diverse oeuvre. Represented in the exhibition were not only his familiar iconic pieces such as *Doppelgangers* and the *Fishtallation* pieces, but rarely seen minimalistic abstract paintings and his last works, the *Contextual Series*.

In May we featured a wonderful exhibition that showcased the iconic plastic beauty-Barbie! *Gendered Object: Barbie as Art* opened on May 19, and we had a great turnout with many of the artists present (artist Deborah Colotti flew in from California!) to talk about their work. Thanks to everyone who volunteered their help and came out to support the show.

It is with great enthusiasm that we are looking forward for things to come. On Saturday, August 4, Safe Harbors will be holding its annual Ann Street Market concurrently with two other wonderful events. Inside the Ann Street Gallery the renowned photographer Dmitri Kasterine's exhibition: *People & Places, 1955-2011* opens, along with his not to be missed, outdoor mural size photographic installation *Newburgh: Portrait of a City* series.

Kasterine has photographed some of the most eminent cultural figures of the twentieth century. Featured in the ASG exhibit are studies of Samuel Beckett, Francis Bacon, Stanley Kubrick and David Hockney. Selections of these portraits plus other notables will be on view in the main gallery. The second component and newer photographic series focuses attention on the citizens of Newburgh's backstreets in a series entitled *Newburgh: Portrait of a City*.

We at the Ann Street Gallery think it is extremely important for art to maintain a presence in everyday life. Art challenges us to think critically, and it creates dialogue about social and civic issues and is essential to a thriving, vital community. Please help us support art in our community!

A Note from our Director of Tenant Services & Special Events

We have so much going on here at Safe Harbors, serving both The Cornerstone Residence and the local community. The second half of the year looks to be as exciting and busy as the first!

Our terrific computer instructor and math tutor Paul Greenwood, has moved to South Carolina-he will be missed! We are currently seeking a new instructor and tutor to take his place.

In the Cornerstone Library, Regina Bizzell, our lead librarian, instituted Game Night where anyone can participate in a friendly game of Scrabble, Life, Chess or Checkers. Regina also continues to host BINGO. As always, we are looking for new or very gently-used gifts for prizes.



The Cornerstone Fitness Center and Wellness program continue to attract more people. If you would like to volunteer as a trainer in the Fitness Center, please call me.

In GED highlights, we had one student pass the GED exam and six students improve their scores. While still working on her GED, another student who started at a 2nd grade reading level has since passed several important exams and is now certified to work as a Home Health Aide and with the developmentally disabled. She also aced the test for the Board of Elections and is now qualified to man voting booths.

We are starting to put an emphasis on getting out of our comfort zone. Independent Living launched a new program this year, "Cornerstone Works!" which is all about jobs, education and volunteering as a way for tenants to find purpose, possibly earn money and connect with others.

We continue to draw record crowds of 250-300 people at our community-geared events like Bells on Broadway, Newburgh Community Cleanup and Cupcake-a-Palooza. What makes these events even better is when our tenants participate and volunteer.

The Cornerstone Tenant Spotlight - Angelo Monge

In 2007, Angelo Monge needed a change in his life. He had a tough time in the Bronx and made the important decision to rehabilitate and start over in the Hudson Valley. One day, while temporarily residing at the Imperial Hotel, he was driving down Broadway and noticed The Cornerstone Residence building. The building made quite an impression and he vowed to himself, "I am going to live there one day." And he did just that! After submitting his application and going through the interview process Angelo moved into The Cornerstone Residence in the fall of 2008. When asked about what appealed to him about The Cornerstone, several things came to mind. The promise of twenty-four hour security and a sober, healthy living environment were both very important factors to him. Amenities like the Cornerstone Library where he can check out books and movies was also a draw. Angelo's life has since slowed down, much to his satisfaction. He has learned to enjoy the little things in life, fishing, reading, etc. He has learned patience and humility since becoming a resident of The Cornerstone. He has met many great people and forged positive friendships with tenant neighbors and people in the community.

During his time here, Angelo has helped out in the computer lab, watering plants throughout the building, and anything else he can do.


A New Season Begins...
